The Puget Sound Clean Air Agency is providing public notice for a proposed Regulatory Order for Primus – University Swaging to limit emissions of 1-Bromopropane, an EPA listed hazardous air pollutant, to less than 9.5 tons per 12-month rolling period. This proposed action is not an approval to increase emissions at the facility.

The draft Order is a Regulatory Order reviewed under PSCAA Regulation I 3.03(f) and would provide the applicant with a federally enforceable emission limit formally establishing it as a minor source of air pollution. This notice is published pursuant to WAC 173-400-091 and WAC 173-400-171(3)(k).

PRELIMINARY DETERMINATION

The Agency has completed a review of application No. 12469. Based on this review, the Agency has made a preliminary determination that the proposal meets all the requirements of Regulations I, II, and III, and draft Order No. 12469 should be approved.

All comments received during the comment period will become part of the public record. Once the Agency has reviewed and responded to comments from the public, the proposed Order will, if necessary, be revised and either denied or issued in final form.
